7                   **I.       COMMISSION’S CONSIDERATION**

8                   A.       Default.       This matter has come before the Criminal Justice Training  
9 Commission (“Commission”), pursuant to RCW 43.101.155(1), WAC 139-06-050(3), and  
10 RCW 34.05.440(1). On April 19, 2018, the Certification Manager Tisha Jones issued a  
11 Statement of Charges (“SOC”) seeking to revoke Stephen Parker’s peace officer certification  
12 based on disqualifying misconduct. The Hearing Coordinator, Sonja Peterson, sent the SOC  
13 along with the required Peace Officer Certification Request for Hearing Form (“Hearing  
14 Request”) and a declaration of service to Stephen Parker (“Respondent”) by email  
15 ([stephengparker@gmail.com](mailto:stephengparker@gmail.com)) and to 1196 Lakeland Circle, Fort Myers, FL on April 23, 2018,  
16 by Certified Mail and regular US Mail. The Certified Mail piece was delivered on April 26,  
17 2018, and signed for (signature not legible).

18                   The Respondent did not request an adjudicative hearing within sixty calendar days of  
19 service of the SOC and Hearing Request as required by RCW 43.101.155(1) and  
20 WAC 139-06-050(2).

21                   B.       Record Presented.       The record presented to the Commission for review and for  
22 entry of a final decision included the following:

2 denying reconsideration is not a prerequisite for filing a petition for review.

3 C. Stay of Effectiveness. The filing of a petition for reconsideration does not  
4 stay the effectiveness of this Order. Any such requests should be made in connection with a  
5 Petition for Judicial Review made under chapter 34.05 RCW and RCW 34.05.550.

6 D. Judicial Review. Proceedings for judicial review may be instituted by filing  
7 a petition in superior court according to the procedures specified in chapter 34.05 RCW, Part V,  
8 Judicial Review and Civil Enforcement (RCW 34.05.510 through .598). The petition for judicial  
9 review of this Order shall be filed with the appropriate court and served on the Commission, the  
10 Office of the Attorney General, and all parties within thirty (30) days after service of this Order,  
11 as provided in RCW 34.05.542.

12 E. Service. For purposes of filing a Petition for Reconsideration or a Petition  
13 for Judicial Review, service is effective upon deposit of this order in the U.S. mail, declaration of  
14 service attached hereto.
