1 **Environment and Climate Caucus Resolution ECC 24-06-22 - ADOPTED** 2 Recognize the Inherent Rights of the Southern Resident Orcas 3 RECOGNIZE THE INHERENT RIGHTS OF SOUTHERN RESIDENT ORCAS 4 WHEREAS, the Southern Resident Orcas are culturally, intrinsically, spiritually, and 5 economically important to the people of Washington State and considered a sacred species to 6 the indigenous people and Tribes of the North Olympic Peninsula; and 7 8 WHEREAS, in May 2018, the Affiliated Tribes of Northwest Indians of the United States passed 9 a resolution recognizing Blackfish, otherwise known as "Orcas", as revered relations for which 10 there is a sacred obligation to ensure they are treated "in a dignified manner that reflects tribal 11 cultural values that have been passed down for countless generations." (1); and 12 13 WHEREAS, despite legal protections at state and federal levels for nearly two decades, the 14 population of Southern Resident Orcas continues to decline and is critically endangered, with 15 less than 75 individuals remaining (2). Major factors for decline include 1960s and 70s captures 16 for marine parks, decimated salmon runs, pollution, loss of habitat, increasing vessel traffic, and 17 noise levels in both Puget Sound and contiguous oceans (3); and 18 19 WHEREAS, the rights of marine mammals to exist and flourish have been recognized, 20 internationally and locally, including through the Helsinki declaration (2010), the Marine Life 21 Proclamation of the city of Malibu, California (2014), and the city of San Francisco's resolution 22 guaranteeing the free and safe passage of whales and dolphins in San Francisco's coastal 23 waters, (2014) (4); and 24 25 WHEREAS, the Northwest Animal Rights Network (NARN) and Legal Rights for the Salish Sea 26 (LRSS) along with a growing number of counties and cities in Washington State including: San 27 Juan County, Jefferson County, Pierce County, Port Townsend, Langley, Bainbridge Island, Des 28 Moines, and Gig Harbor have signed proclamations recognizing the inherent rights of Southern 29 Resident Orcas, 30 31 THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Environment and Climate Caucus of the Washington 32 State Democratic Party asks legislators to adopt and enforce legislation in 2025 and beyond 33 that recognizes and enforces the 'inherent rights' of the Southern Resident Orcas including, but 34 not limited to, the right to life, liberty, autonomy, free and safe passage, adequate food supply 35 from naturally occurring sources, and freedom from conditions that cause orcas physical, 36 emotional, or mental harm, and 37 38 THEREFORE BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED that this resolution shall be forwarded to the 39 Washington State Governor, all Washington State House and Senate Democrats and the House 40 Civil Rights and Judiciary Committee.
